variety of colours: red, yellow, orange or brown. Challenge: Find 1 green leaf, 2 brown leaves, 3 orange leaves, 4 yellow leaves and 5 red leaves.

#### **Acorn and Conker Counting**

Collect 5 acorns, 5 conkers, or 5 pinecones. Use them for counting and simple math games. Challenge: Try counting how many you have found. Can you make groups of 5 or 10?

Please bring all your nature treasure to the preschool after the half term break.

# **Upcoming Events**

**4**<sup>th</sup> **November, Diwali** – a day filled with light, fun and learning. We are excited to celebrate Diwali, the Festival of Lights with children. We will explore this beautiful tradition by creating colourful rangoli patterns, making sparkly lanterns and listening to the stories about Diwali.

**5**<sup>th</sup> **November, Bonfire Night** – children will create a colourful firework art using paint and glitter, listen to stories about fireworks, and learn about the bright colours and sound of a bonfire. We will also talk about staying safe while enjoying the excitement of the Bonfire Night.

11<sup>th</sup> November, Remembrance Day – we will gently introduce the children to Remembrance Day by talking about kindness, peace and helping others. Children will make poppy crafts to honour the day and share a short, age-appropriate story about remembering those who helped to keep us safe. Children will participate in a peaceful moment to reflect and show respect by staying silent for one minute.

**13**<sup>th</sup> **November, World Kindness Day** – we will celebrate World Kindness Day by encouraging the children to practise and share kindness in fun and meaningful ways. Create a 'Kindness Tree'. Each time a child performs a kind act, they can add a leaf to the tree with their name and the action that they did.
